

BETWEEN LAND AND SEA

First, and best-known, are those long (140 km), sandy beaches stretching as far as the eye can see, which characterise the Vendée's seaside resorts. These have long been family favourites for their safety and for the great variety of activities they offer.

Noirmoutier Island

Offshore lie the Island of Noirmoutier and the Island of Yeu. Their whitewashed houses, coloured shutters and Mediterranean-style vegetation add a touch of elegance, a special style so dear to island-lovers

Surfers and kite-surfers head for the "spots" ground La Tranche sur Mer or Saint Gilles Croix de Vie, 6 sites of regular international championships.


The seaside is, of course, the place for yacht racing – in which the Vendée Globe in Les Sables d'Olonne is the undisputed world leader.



The Vendée's architecture ranges from Romanesque churches and medieval castles to fishermen's cottages and tiny thatched farmhouses. The 12th-century abbeys of Maillezais and Nieul sur l'Autise stand on the fringes of the tranquil "Venise Verte", or "Green Venice", a charming rural landscape in the heart of the Marais poitevin.



For those who prefer a world without cars, it's easy to take to simpler modes of transport such as a horse, a bike, or simply one's feet. Today, 1,800 km of cycle paths lead to every corner of the Vendée, from Fontenay le Comte (Town of Art and History) to Mervent (legendary domain of the French fairy Mélusine), and from the Marais poitevin northward to the unmissable theme park of Puy du Fou

GASTRONOMY FROM THE LAND AND THE SEA

Bar: Sea bass.

Bigorneau: Periwinkle.

Bulots: Whelks.

Choucroute de la mer: Sauerkraut served with different types of fish.

Gâche: Gâche is a sort of local brioche from the Vendée.

Crêpe: Large, thin, wheat-flour pancake either sweet or savoury.

Crevette grise: Shrimp.
Crevette rose: Prawn

Fine de claire: Type of cultivated oyster.

Flan ou Fion: Sweet or savoury custard tart.

Fressure vendéenne: Pig's liver, heart, lungs and spleen cooked in blood and served cold.

Galette (de blé noir): Buck-wheat-flour pancake filled with cheese, meat or fish.

Huître: Oyster.

La Bonnotte: A rare variety of potato cultivated on the Island of Noirmoutier.

Langoustine: A large prawn.

Mogettes et jambon de Vendée: A type of white haricot bean and raw ham cured in dry salt.

Moules à la marinière: Mussels cooked in a creamy sauce with tumeric and saffron.

Préfou: Garlic bread served at aperitif time.

Rillauds / rillons: Bits of pork cooked in seasoned lard and preserved in jars.

Rillettes: Bits of pork or goose meat which are first prepared as rillauds, then using a mortar and pestle, it is pounded into a paste and preserved in stoneware pot.

Sardine: Sardine or pilchard.


Sole: Dover sole.

Tourteau: A type of large crab.

10 TASTY SOUVENIRS

from Vendée

- Refined tinned sardines from the canning factory "La Perle des Dieux" in Saint Gilles Croix de Vie. Freshly caught sardines, the best of the season, are selected and prepared by hand in the traditional way.
- Fish soup, rillettes, marinated anchovies, mogettes from La Conserverie "La Sablaise", a family-run canning factory in Olonne sur Mer.
- Brioche: This is a well-known pastry in Vendée. It is usually eat for breakfast. In the past, it was made for family celebrations such as communions, weddings...
- Glasswort (Salicorne): a salt-marsh plant rich in vitamins and minerals, used to season salads or fish.
- 5 Finest-quality sea salt.
- 6 A bottle of wine from the Fiefs Vendéens vineyards.
- 7 Kamok: a locally-made coffee liqueur created in 1860 in Luçon.
- 8 La Troussepinette: a local aperitif made with black thorns from plum trees.
- La Napoline: chocolates in the shape of Napoléon's bust , created by Patrick Gelencser in La Roche sur Yon.
- Creamy salted caramel or biscuits from Biscuiterie "Les Petits Cagniotes" on the Island of Noirmoutier.













