

"Giddy up!"

Whether you're on an electric bike or the old-fashioned kind, *A modern Journey through an old Land* is an itinerary that is perfectly secured and accessible to all, where you will always find rental shops, repair stands, or fellow cyclists to help repair your bike in the event of a technical mishap (within reason, of course...).

Be it as a family, among friends, on your own, or in tandem, this cycling itinerary is divided into 6 sections, borrowing some of the greatest hits from other circuits like *La Loire à Vélo, La Vélodyssée* and *La Vélomaritime*, and covering a total of 500 km!

Before leaving, make sure to bring along a basic repair kit (inner tubes, patches, a pump), wear a helmet, fill your water bottle to the brim, bring your trail mix, and keep in mind that the entire itinerary has been tested and secured for your cycling pleasure. So, giddy up for the new adventures awaiting you!


"The starting line for A modern Journey through an old Land is green – just like the colour of the Le Voyage à Nantes line."

This year-round tour of cultural sites will guide you to stunning heritage buildings, remarkable views of the city, and more than a hundred open-air works of art.

After strolling through this iconic 22-kilometre circuit, you will leave the hubbub of the city behind to reach the Ocean. Slowly, the landscape changes and the horizon widens.

The Loire is a trusty travel companion whose face changes along the way. Simultaneously pristine, industrial, and close to nature, the river points the way to the Ocean and the calm of the sea.

"Then head to Couëron where you can get a taste of *Paradis.*"

From the centre of Nantes, follow the northern bank of the Loire past Quai des plantes and the Maillé Brézé - a warship and naval museum - to reach the town of Indre, where you will then head out to Couëron and get a taste of Paradis - a flashy bistro you can't miss.

Here's where you can cross the Loire thanks to a little ferry (free, no reservation required). Once you're on the south bank in Le Pellerin, turn right towards Canal de La Martinière. To get an unobstructed view of Tatzu Nishi's Villa Cheminée, take the first right after Le Quai Vert in Frossay, then slalom your way through a natural reserve. Once you're done, retrace your steps to reach Paimbœuf - Nantes' former outport - with both feet firmly planted in the estuary.



"In Corsept, once you've passed the cemetery, immediately turn right. There are signs, but you never know..."

Upon leaving Paimbœuf, you will reach Corsept and its fisheries, where it is important not to wander about too much. Once you pass the cemetery, immediately take the first right. The rest of the path slowly zooms in on Saint-Nazaire's XXL bridge. To cross it, several options are available. In July and August, the Loire-Atlantique département provides a free shuttle bus that requires no reservation (tandems and cargobikes are not accepted). During low season, bus no. 317 takes you from the Saint-Brevin bus station to the Saint-Nazaire station. Reservations must be made the day before at +33 (0)2 40 21 50 87. From this city of great shipyards, head to La Baule. Follow the signs to Pornichet or Boucle 14.



"La Baule, the ideal backdrop to gently start this new itinerary, with your pedals practically in the water."

La Baule is a member of the elite club of the most beautiful bays in the world. Its hidden villas, sheltered from the seafront, offer you the ideal backdrop to gently start this new itinerary, with your pedals practically in the water. Once this charming detour is behind you, an even more pristine horizon awaits with the region's flora and salt marshes.

Even though the *Modern Journey* doesn't always flirt with the Atlantic Ocean, its aura is never very far away.

The sea bobs in an out of sight as you calmly zig-zag your way towards Pénestin, with its protected beach La Mine d'or and its golden cliffs.

STAGE 2 SAINT-NAZAIRE (VIA LA BAULE) / **PENESTIN** → 82.78 km

"In Guérande, the City of Art and History, travel back in time to discover the medieval city and stop to fill your water bottle."

A unique quality of this stretch of your journey is that it reveals a little-known side of La Baule. After Avenue Lajarrige and its charming boutiques, turn right and follow the Vélocéan bike path. In the shortest of bike rides, head in the direction of Guérande and discover the inland areas near La Baule, with its winding, shaded pathways. In Guérande, the "City of Art and History", travel back in time to discover the medieval city and stop to fill your water bottle. Once you're topped up, glide down at full tilt toward the salt marshes.

To reach Piriac-sur-Mer, don't dilly-dally: follow the Vélocéan signs in order to leave the very popular coastal road, and head inland - which is just as breathtaking.



After Saint-Molf, ride through the Bassin du Mès salt marshes between the Loire and the Vilaine rivers. This territory is also home to 180 different species of birds.

Up and down, right and left... no matter where you look, this route will dazzle you. Make sure to follow the signs to Pont-Mahé, and let them guide you to Pénestin and the finish line, which hugs the colourful contours of Mine d'Or beach, with its ochre and golden cliffs.




STAGE 3 PÉNESTIN / REDON → 58.12 km

"This circuit can almost be done handsfree – but always with an eye on this guide, the road, and the stunning Breton countryside..."

We won't lie to you: for now, the third stage of A Modern Journey is the least clearly marked-out of the itinerary. However, it would be a shame to cross it off your list since you'd miss out on a few natural gems that can only be appreciated by bike.

With the seaport of Redon in your sights, this circuit can almost be done handsfree – but always with an eye on this guide, the road, and the stunning Breton countryside...



PÉNESTIN / LA ROCHE-BERNARD → 22.10 km

REDON → 58.12 km

"And what if happiness for a cyclist was slaloming down bends in the road...?"

As Pénestin shrinks in the distance behind you, take the "voie 5 Bretagne", Le Tréhiguier. You'll arrive at your destination after riding a gentle slope - one that reveals a perfectly picture-postcard port.

Once here, you'll have no choice but to get off your bicycle and take in the view. Then, when you're good and ready, get back on the path and turn left then right through the curvy routes of the Breton countryside. And what if happiness for a cyclist was slaloming down bends in the road...?

You'll answer with a resounding "Yes!" as you reach La Roche-Bernard, with its tiny streets, worn smooth over time.



"With its old port, stunning view of the Vilaine River, and maze of tiny streets, La Roche-Bernard is a paradise of both zigs and zags."

The kind that might make you pleasantly dizzy – but nothing that will slow you down from reaching Nivillac where, after passing the church, you'll continue straight ahead. A few metres further, turn left onto D176 – a rather calm *départementale* road – to reach Théhillac.

This is the itinerary we tested out, but regional roads being what they are, it may not be suitable for everyone. And, even though there are, as yet, no signs until Le Bellion, we advise you to contact the La Roche-Bernard tourist office: it offers an exclusive map dedicated to this very road so that no one loses their way on this section of the circuit (please see dotted itinerary).

Once in Le Bellion, you'll reach $La\ V\'elodyss\'ee-$ and, more importantly, the Nantes-Brest Canal, which is synonymous with a smooth landing in Redon, a small town that has all the makings of a big one, that sits at the crossroads of the Western waterways and the Nantes-Brest Canal where the Channel meets the Atlantic Ocean.





STAGE 4 REDON / RENNES → 94.34 km



From Redon to Rennes, the paths of the Vilaine Valley will speed beneath your tires – which should be safe from harm since the regional government had the good sense to set up repair stations all along the way!

Even if it's impossible to get lost here, you must follow Voie 42 Bretagne – and make sure to enjoy the landscapes... Here too, it's hard to miss the finish line, which stands there like a totem: Roazhon Park, the green rectangular pitch and home to *les rouges et noirs* of Stade Rennais FC.

Then, without a moment to lose, head straight into the heart of Brittany's capital, with its traditional timber-framed houses, the Parliament of Brittany and the Thabor gardens – all of which combine perfectly with contemporary architecture by Jean Nouvel and Christian de Portzamparc.

Both dynamic and cultural, you can enjoy Rennes by bike at whatever speed you wish.



REDON / MESSAC → 43.18 km

"If you want to leave Redon, whatever you do, do not return to the Nantes-Brest Canal! Do it, and you may never reach the high point of this Modern Journey through an oldLand:
Le Mont-Saint-Michel."


If you want to leave Redon, whatever you do, do not return to the Nantes-Brest Canal! Do it, and you may never reach the high point of this *Modern Journey through an old Land*: Le Mont-Saint-Michel.

Instead, follow the clearly indicated path along the Vilaine River and drift along to Brain-sur-Vilaine, a must-visit stop, where bicycles are always welcome at Roul'Vilaine: a bike rental shop in Pays de Redon. This route is flat and varied enough to never fall into the monotony that can by typical with this kind of circuit.

"Don't forget to turn left at Pont-Réan bridge in the towns of Bruz and Guichen in order to cross the river."

For the next leg of your journey, you'll want to keep the same (calm) pace to match the same (calm) landscapes. Keep heading straight. Along the way, you might be surprised to see an abundance of miniature houses.

Along the Vilaine River, you'll find countless tiny homes made either from a mishmash of materials, or meticulously built. Their lucky inhabitants appear to embody the perfect image of a happy life along the water. Don't forget to turn left at Pont-Réan bridge in the towns of Bruz and Guichen in order to cross the river.

And now, Rennes is all yours. The calm of the countryside suddenly gives way to the energy of the city.



This new chapter in the Modern Journey could be called "How the West Was Won" – with an equally breathtaking script.

From Rennes to Saint-Malo, the main actor of this open-air road movie is the Canal d'Ille-et-Rance.

And even if it's visible from the opening shot to the end credits, its profile changes so often that this voyage is more than a stroll in the park – it's an ode to freedom.

And what if the Far West was actually Voie 42 Bretagne...? Action, and full speed ahead to Saint-Malo: a finale of stone buildings and fortifications, where tales of adventure and conquest abound.

Robert Surcouf, Jacques Cartier or Chateaubriand will be your illustrious seafaring companions.

"All along the way, there will be fishing, walking, running, chatting... In a word: life!"

To leave Rennes, nothing could be simpler: follow the Vilaine River and high-tail it down the towpaths alongside Canal d'Ille-et-Rance.

As you ride, and the chirping birds cheer you on, you'll most likely find yourself indulging in the (necessarily subjective) act of classifying the canal locks in order of beauty. (In Hédé-Bazouges, we've counted eleven of them.)

All along the way, there will be fishing, walking, running, chatting... In a word: life! And the best part of this itinerary is that you can switch from one bank to the other to your heart's content.



Here, your *Modern Journey* will continue to along the same lines: flat, gently paced, and relaxed. But, despite the clear delight of riding alongside the canal, you'll find final stretch of this leg to be full of surprises. Like when, after a long straight line, the town of Léhon proudly puffs out its chest. (And, deservedly so!).

Léhon has been awarded the label "Petite Cité de Caractère de Bretagne®" and merits a stopover. Its Abbaye Saint-Magloire sits on the crossroads where Jean-Jacques Annaud's *The Name of the Rose* meets *Harry Potter*. You will feel like you're in another era, guaranteed. From here on in, you will see a series of life-sized postcards: Dinan's port, Saint-Suliac – listed among the "Most Beautiful Villages in France" – with its Mount Garrot, which requires an extra effort on your legs, and obviously Saint-Malo, the "corsair city" *par excellence*.

L'Art au fil de la Rance is an itinerary of in situ artistic installations, inviting you to discover the remarkable architectural and natural heritage sites on the banks of the Rance.



According to local saying we heard at the foot of Saint-Malo's fortifications, "If it rains a lot at night, the day will be lovely." But this is quickly revealed to be untrue... Whatever the weather conditions, the first part of this circuit moves quietly towards Cancale, famous since the dawn of time for its oysters and shellfish that can be enjoyed without even getting off your bike.

Here, two-wheeled travellers no longer surprise anyone. You'll need to use your calves to get out of the port, where you'll be rewarded with flatter ground and the English Channel.
